

Hornsby/Ku-ring-gai Bush Fire Risk Management Plan

INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO READ THE MAPS AND TABLES

How to find the risk ratings, actions, timeframes and responsible agencies that have been allocated to a site of interest to you...

Step 1.

Look at the first map – the ‘Overview Map – Map Display Areas (MDA)’ and identify the location of the site you are interested in knowing about on the map.

Note the MDA number (the large bold numbers) – or the ‘Map Display Area’ your site is covered by.

Step 2.

Look at the relevant numbered map (see top right hand corner of the maps) and again identify the location of the site you are interested in knowing about on the map.

Step 3.

Find the small black number with a white halo that is on or close to your site (more than one may be relevant). This is the ‘Asset ID’ number. Note the ‘Asset ID’ number(s).

Step 4.

Go to the table document – the ‘Asset and Treatment Table’ and look the number up in the ‘Asset ID’ column.

Step 5.

Examine the table and note information across the page. This will identify risk ratings, actions, timeframes and agencies that have been decided upon to manage bush fire risk to the site.

Not all sites have been allocated actions. If no actions have been specifically allocated for your site then have a look at adjacent sites. Treatments that address bush fire risk for other sites may also benefit your site of interest, e.g. a hazard reduction burn further up a valley.

- Examine the second part of the table document – the ‘Risk Assessment Table’ for more information on the risk rating of the site. Note ‘Map ref no.’ = ‘Asset ID’.
- The maps in the plan are not maps of bush fire prone areas – these maps identify a range of assets that may be at risk from bush fire.
